WestK x HKYAF: Miller Performing Arts –

Gen Last

A chance to change the fate of humankind 7–9.11.2024 | The Box, Freespace, WestK

(24 September 2024, Hong Kong) – In the face of extreme weather conditions and the imminent collapse of civilisation, what would you do if you held the destiny of humanity in your hands?

The original musical *Gen Last* tells a story of climate change, coexistence with nature, empowerment and optimism. Written and directed by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation founder Lindsey McAlister, the production features a talented cast of 64 young Hong Kong performers aged 7 to 25, and is co-presented and co-produced by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation and WestK, with Miller Performing Arts as project partner and supported by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council.

It is the year 2055. On a bleak and desolate post-apocalyptic wasteland, a group of young people with extraordinary psychic powers are drawn together from different corners of the globe. They are the enigmatic Crystal Children of *Gen Last*.

Navigating the world alone, they confront the consequences of our failure to heed the warnings of climate change, hopeful that they can rebuild civilisation from the ashes.

A theatrical production about a global issue: climate change

Since 2020, Lindsey McAlister has created theatrical works about social issues affecting young people today. In 2020, #hashtag tackled the deceptive world of social media. In 2021, Only a Girl presented the bittersweet LGBT+ tale of a girl's road to self-discovery. In 2022, I'mperfect explored the problem of body image issues, and in 2023, 24:7:365 looked at the complex nature of obsessive-compulsive disorder.

To develop this year's script around the issue of climate change, Lindsey consulted marine mammal expert Dr Lindsay Porter OBE, former assistant director of HK Observatory Leung Wing-mo, and her own son Sam Inglis, a climate scientist and glaciologist. The information she gleaned was vital for helping her create an engaging theatrical work that accurately reflected the facts and inspired the audience to address an urgent global issue.

Talking about the production, Lindsey said, "Art is a universal language. It transcends barriers, creating immersive experiences that can make climate change tangible. By harnessing our creativity, we can spark crucial conversations and motivate change. Rather than sitting back and doing nothing, we can take the matter into our own hands and play a part in encouraging global governments to take proactive measures in addressing these urgent issues."

The top-notch production team behind the musical

Gen Last is supported by a brilliant creative team, including experienced music director Amuer Calderon and up-and-coming French stage costume designer Lola Clavel. To communicate the musical's core messages effectively, Amuer Calderon produced five original songs. Lola Clavel, a semi-finalist in the 2022 Redress Design Award, proposed partnering with the non-profit fashion organisation Redress. The resulting collaboration integrated upcycling and redesigned recycled materials in the creation of the stage costumes, minimising the use of resources in line with the production's themes.

Each year, the creation and staging of HKYAF's annual flagship musical supports and nurtures local performing talents, offering youngsters the chance to take part in rigorous, professional training and perform in an industry-standard stage production. *Gen Last* marks the second year of the partnership between HKYAF and WestK, reinforcing both parties' long-held belief in the transformative power of the arts and their commitment to nurturing creativity and inspiration in young people.

Gen Last is co-presented and co-produced by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation and WestK, with Miller Performing Arts as project partner and supported by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council. It premieres November 7 to 9 at The Box, Freespace in WestK.
